

A World Tennis Number (WTN) fogalma az ITF fejlesztési programjában jelent meg az amerikai UTR minősítési "rating" rendszer mintájára.

A UTR rövid angol nyelvű ismertetője ezen a linken keresztül érhető el :

Az amerikai UTR már egy létező és működésben lévő rendszer, a WTN az ITF tervei szerint jövő év januárjától indulhatna teszt üzemmódban.

Mindkét minősítési rendszer gyakorlatilag egy olyan ranglista készítő algoritmust takar, amely összehasonlítja a játékosok egymás ellen elért számszerű eredményeit, és ebből kalkulálja ki egymáshoz képest az egyes versenyzők játékerejét.

Ez az egységes rating rendszer képes lehet egyesíteni a magyar tenisz társadalom minden szegmensét és ezáltal egy hiteles adatbázis forrást is biztosíthatna a szövetség számára hosszútávon.

A játékosok nemtől, kortól és játéktudástól függetlenül felkerülnek a minősítési listára (erősorrendre) az elmúlt 12 hónapban lejátszott mérkőzéseik eredményei alapján, amennyiben a WTN rendszer által hitelesített versenysorozat versenyein vesznek részt.

Tehát az MTSZ-nek "csak" hitelesíteni kell a versenyrendszerét az ITF-nél és innentől kezdve az összes MTSZ versenyeredmény bekerül az WTN algoritmus rendszerébe, ami alapján a játékosok a minősítési listán előrébb léphetnek. Mivel az amatőr versenyektől, az utánpótlás versenyeken át egészen a profi versenyekig részei a rendszernek, így egy 12 éves tehetséges játékos tudása is könnyen összehasonlítható akár egy 45 éves erős amatőr játékosával is, ami megnyitja a lehetőséget, akár összevont versenyek életre hívásának is, szélesítve és színesítve ezzel a palettát a magyar versenyrendszerben.

Az ITF angol nyelvű részletes leírása a WTN rendszerről következő oldalakon olvasható. A Magyar Tenisz Szövetség már több mint egy éve tárgyal az ITF-el a rendszer bevezetéséről. Létrejött már egy 37 oldalas angol nyelvű együttműködési és csatlakozási szerződés tervezet is, ami már jogi véleményezés alatt van de ez a folyamat az elmúlt évben elakadt, a szövetségben végbemenő ismert történések miatt.

Érdemes lenne ezt a folyamatot újraindítani azzal a céllal, hogy esetleg 2021 április 1-től teszt üzemmódban bevezetésre kerülhessen a rendszer a magyar versenyrendszerbe.

Amennyiben pozitív tapasztalatokat hoz a rendszer, akkor akár már 2022-től a teljes körű bevezetése is lehetséges lenne, bár a szakmai oldalon ebben a témában nem teljes az egyetértés és még rengeteg tisztázandó kérdés van.









Inclusive: A single scale that can be custom displayed by gender and age category.

Global: Used both at amateur (clubs, national association tournament level) as well as non professional and professional ITF Circuits.

Localised Opportunities: Players can use their Number to compare themselves on a global scale whilst finding local opponents. This reduces the need to travel and will be beneficial to smaller nations with less resources. This new tool will help players decide whether to travel to a specific tournament by knowing in advance the ability of the players in that specific event.

Common Language: To inspire players at all levels to play more often and enjoy the game more.

Game zONe: The Game zONe points out suitable Numbers on the scale to help a player find opponents around their level to play against.



Adaptation: ITF will provide assistance and training to national associations in order for them to easily adapt ITF World Tennis Number to their current system if needed.

Property: The data is property of the ITF and the national associations, no third parties are involved.

Security and privacy: The exchange of data is safely secured via legally binding Data Protection agreements between the ITF and the national associations.

Commercialisation: National associations will be able to exploit the product at national level.

Product: Advanced digital platform combined with a highly accurate, state-of-the-art algorithm developed by world-leading data scientists.





EXAMPLES OF COMMERCIAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR NATIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

Domestic sponsorship deals: National associations can commercialise their own systems and platforms via domestic sponsorship deals (sponsorship categories to be agreed with the ITF).

Tournament fees: More and different tournament formats using the Numbers will provide adequate competitions to players of all levels. The ITF will introduce new competitions at amateur levels in collaboration with national and regional associations.

Website traffic: ITF World Tennis Numbers are a meaningful data feature that will add more interest and valuable content to a national association system or website.


New Players: The national association receives the data of tennis players who come directly to the platform to use the website and obtain a Number.

Players' license: ITF World Tennis Number can be a complementary service that a national association can efficiently add to a membership package (but not separately charged for).

Players' fees: More players from overseas can easily play in your nation. Visitors bring their Number with them, equipped with the ability to find meaningful competitions and opponents.

What is the ITF World Tennis Number?

The ITF World Tennis Number is a Number assigned to a tennis player that reflects their current level of playing ability. We have created a Number that can be used globally to help players identify opponents of an appropriate standard to play against. The aim of the ITF World Tennis Number is to encourage more players of all ages, genders and abilities to pick up a racket and play #gameon.




The scale

The ITF World Tennis Number scale goes from 40-1.

As a complete beginner a player receives a Number of 40 which can gradually start to improve as they play.

Associations will have the option to display a players Number with a decimal place. This will show greater precision around their standard of play.

The Game Zone points out Numbers on the scale around a players level that we think will be a good match for them. This allows them to find a suitable opponent!

- A Number for singles and doubles that can be used around the world
- A modern online system that will update a player's number regularly
- A Number for everyone regardless of age and gender
- A searchable online community of players
- Statistics to analyse a players game including win/loss ratio and head to head comparisons

 Consistent standards and processes for data sharing. This can empower fast efficient digital interaction with ITF, other National Regional Associations and their suppliers/customers








Player Profile

The intention is to update the ITF World Tennis Number on a weekly basis.






Player Search

Players can filter the search results by gender, location and Number range, then click through to their selected player profile.






Head to Head Match Up
